COURSE OBJECTIVES AND OUTLINE

This activity is a novel conference emphasizing faculty and audience participation with real patient cases discussed by Master Teachers. It is designed to provide interactive education on the advances in percutaneous, peripheral and surgical interventions, cardiac imaging and prevention. Upon completion of the course, participants should be able to:

- Comprehend the indications of remodeling surgery and cardiac assist devices for treatment of Congestive Heart Failure
- Understand the future directions in Cardiovascular Surgical procedures, Off Pump Surgery and Robotics
- Learn uses and limitations of modern vascular imaging technology
- Understand current concepts in cardiovascular prevention and treatment
- Understand the link between obesity, hypertension, hyperlipidemia, diabetes and "metabolic syndrome."
- Review current updates in Advanced Cardiac Life Support

TARGET AUDIENCE

This conference is designed for physicians in the following specialties: Cardiology, family medicine, cardiovascular disease, general surgery, critical care surgery, interventional cardiology, cardiac electrophysiology, pediatric cardiothoracic surgery, pediatric cardiology, thoracic surgery, vascular medicine, vascular surgery, internal medicine, nephrology and neurology. It is also appropriate for cardiovascular technologists, pharmacists and cardiac nurses.

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

Submission of abstracts for the Second "MIRS" opens on October 1, 2003.

MIRS Abstract Review Committee calls upon all investigators to submit abstracts of original contribution to be considered for Poster Presentations. Notification of abstract selection will be emailed to submitting authors by January 16, 2004.

The deadline for submissions is January 9, 2004.

Each abstract will be peer-reviewed by a panel of interventional cardiologists and cardiothoracic surgeons. Accepted abstracts will be posted at the conference on February 6, 2004 from 7:00 AM – 5:00 PM and presented on February 7, 2004 at 1:30 PM.

All abstract presentations will be in English and should be e-mailed to: mileng@miami.edu. The best abstract will be acknowledged; the winner will be chosen based on originality and clinical relevance. The Summit Committee is unable to reimburse faculty for travel and hotel expenses, but the registration fee will be waived for authors of chosen abstracts.

Policies

1. Submission of an abstract constitutes a commitment by the author(s) to present if accepted, and the presenter must be one of the co-authors listed.
2. Structure the content into: Background, Methods, Results and Conclusion sections.
3. No abbreviations should be used in the title; if used in the body of the abstract, abbreviations should appear in parenthesis after the full word the first time.
4. If the author(s) has/have any relationship with a commercial entity, a disclosure statement delineating the nature of the relationship should be displayed at the beginning of the presentation.
5. Length: 250 words or fewer.
6. Posters need to fit in a 4'x 6' format; poster display boards will be available for mounting posters.
